ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE LAND

We offer the following acknowledgment of the communities of Indigenous People who first lived in the land we call the Willamette Valley. These are the tribes with whom we are walking together even today: the Kalapuya , tribes that include Tualatin (Atfalati), Yamhill (Yamel), Ahantchuyuk (Pudding River), Luckiamute, Santiam, Chepenefa (Mary's River), Chemapho (Muddy Creek), Tsankupi (Calapooia River), Mohawk (Mohawk River, OR; unrelated to the Mohawks of NY), Chafan (near Eugene), Chelamela (Long Tom River), Winefelly (Mohawk, McKenzie and Coast Forks of the Willamette River), and the Yoncalla peoples.

PRAYER FOR GOING DEEPER

- One: Creator of Justice, we lift up our local community and the challenges we face together. For those experiencing homelessness and hunger, those struggling with addiction, and those seeking safety and shelter.
- Many: May your love move us to act with compassion and generosity.
- One: We pray for those in our schools, hospitals, and service organizations the teachers, caregivers, first responders, and essential workers who labor tirelessly to support others.

Many: May your love sustain and strengthen them.

One: Giver of Comfort, we bring before you the names and faces of those we hold dear: For the sick and the grieving, for the lonely and the anxious, and for all who need your healing presence. We pray especially for...

Many: May your love surround and uphold them.

One: And we bring the prayers of our hearts that are too deep for words... *(sharing the silence)*

One: We pray for ourselves that we might live as bearers of your love in our relationships and daily lives. Help us to speak words of kindness, offer acts of mercy, and embody your justice wherever we go.

Many: May your love guide us in all we do.

One: Holy One, receive these prayers we lift to you in hope and love, and hear us as we join together, as one community, and raise our voices in the spirit of the prayer that Jesus taught us, saying:

Our Creator, who is in heaven and among us,

Sacred is your name.

May your way of love come,

May your will be done,

On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us today the bread we need for life,

And forgive us when we fall short,

As we forgive those who harm us.
